

Give your Elm a shot in the arm!

Or perhaps a shot in the trunk is more precise. Arboriculture Solutions, Professional Tree Care is excited to announce a new service available this spring to protect Elms from Dutch Elm disease (DED). Arboriculture Solutions will be Kawarthas authorized distributor of DutchTrig; (www.dutchtrig.com) a biological inoculation to build the immune system of elms to resist DED. DutchTrig has been used extensively in Europe since 1992 and the United States since 1995, and has just been approved by Health Canada for use in Canada.

It is calculated that roughly 100 million Elm trees have been lost to DED since its discovery



in North America in the forties. Extensive research shows DutchTrig is proven to prevent DED in 99% of vaccinated Elms!

Make Tree Work Part of your Spring Cleanup

While raking up all those leaves and branches this spring, make sure to look up and see where they came from. Spring is a great time to assess your trees, before the leaves come out and block the view of the trunk and branches.
